Above is the mascot for the University of Texas at Austin, alongside the campus.

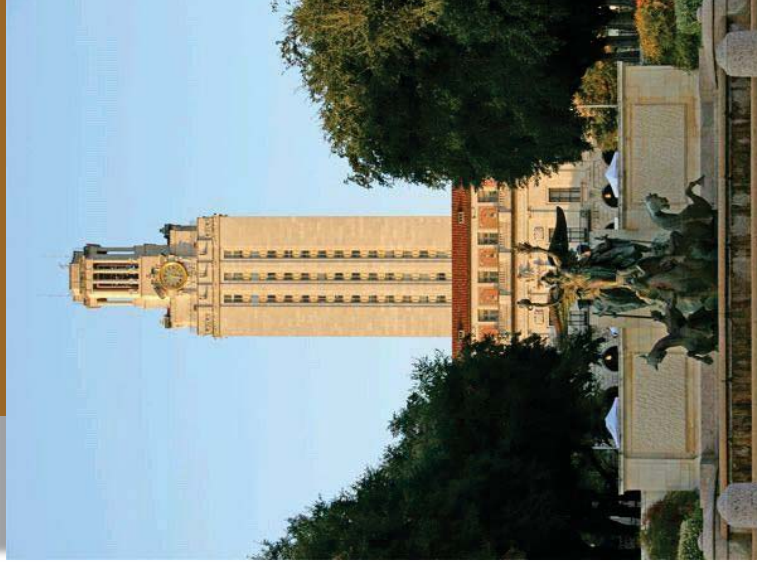
Seal & Motto for UT Austin

The mission of the University of Texas at Austin is to achieve excellence in the interrelated areas of undergraduate education, graduate education, research, and public service.

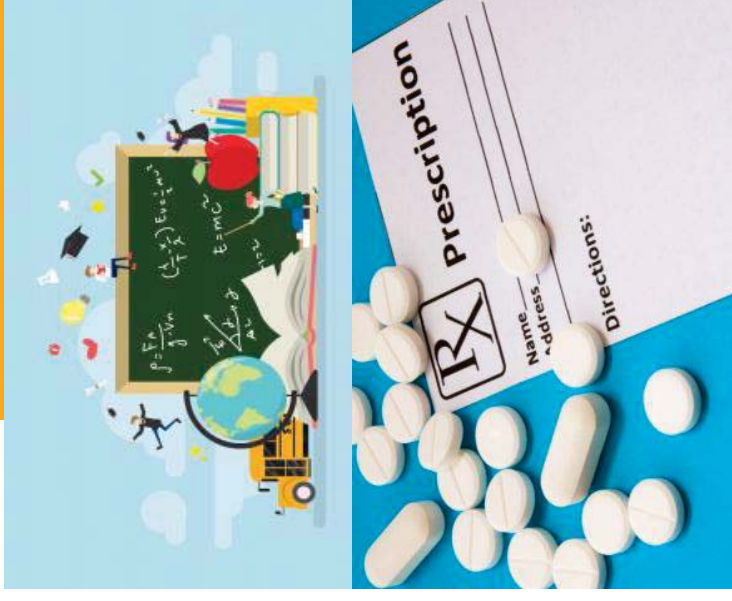


History of University of Texas at Austin

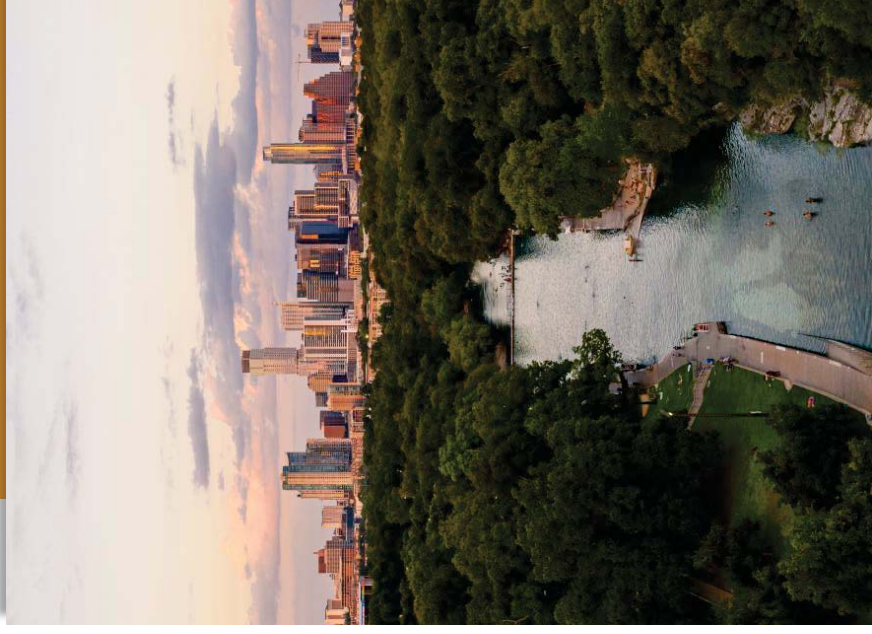

Statistics about University of Texas at Austin

At the University of Texas at Austin, 51,832 students are enrolled. Approximately 38.5% of applicants are accepted into UT Austin. 54.4% of UT Austin students are female; 45.6% of UT Austin students are male. For ethnicity and race, 0.1% is American Indian or Alaskan Native, 20.2% is Asian, 5.3% is Black, 23.4% is Hispanic, 10% is international, 2.7% is Multiracial, 0.1% is Native Hawaiian/other Pacific Islander, 1.2% is Unknown, and 38.9% is White. The four-year graduation rate is 80.8%.

Requirements for enrollment

- *UT Austin requires you to have at least a 1240 on your SAT and a 27 on your ACT.*
- *It is recommended that you take AP, IB, and Honors classes to get into UT Austin.*
- *All freshman applicants must submit an essay to be admitted.*
- *It is required that you have at least a 3.83 as your GPA.*
- *If you're not in the top 10%, it is unlikely you will be accepted, but there isn't a specific ranking required. Students who are in the top 6% of their school are automatically admitted, though.*

Fun Facts about UT Austin

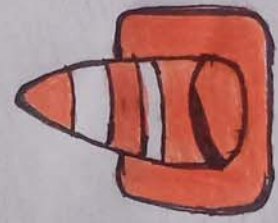
